FORMER mayor Ross Williams has been elected deputy mayor of Hunter's Hill Council.

Councillor Williams, who previously served as mayor from 1989 to 1993, was elected unopposed at Monday night's first meeting of the new council.

Mr Williams will serve in the role for one year after the council voted on a one-year term for the position rather than a full three year term.

"I do appreciate the privilege this council has given me to be deputy mayor again," Mr Williams said.

"I wish the councillors well and look forward to some robust debate over the next three years."

Mr Williams offered his congratulations to the new mayor of Hunters Hill, Mark Bennett.

"You worked very hard during your campaign.



"I would also like to congratulate the other councillors around the table as well. This was a very significant election, probably the most significant in the last 150 years.
