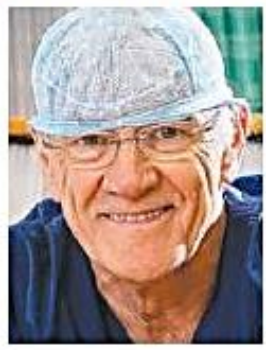


FEDERAL ELECTION CANDIDATES FOR NORTH SYDNEY 2 JULY 2016

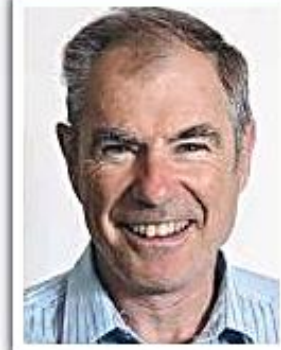
**Stephen Ruff,

Greens**

He served for the Democrats for nine years in the NSW Upper House. Environmental issues are front and centre.



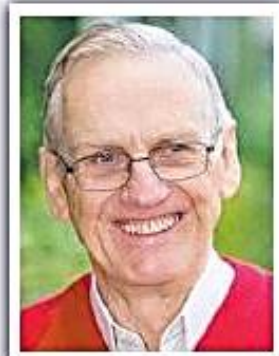
**Trent Zimmerman,
